1883	John Webb given land west of Sea Road to develop, called the Egerton Park Estate. It is
	not known if it was Earl De La Warr or John Webb who named the land. The Egerton family are
	related to the De La Warrs through marriage.
1884-1896	Roads and drains on Egerton Park laid out by John Webb.
1888-1892	Egerton Park formed from a low lying lagoon/salt marsh area which was liable to flood.
1891	The first swimming competition was held at the Egerton Park Baths.
1892	Boating lake, cricket ground, upgraded swimming bath, tennis lawns, water for fishing, cycle track
	and concert pavilion in operation at Egerton Park.
1896-1901	Houses in Egerton Road and Park Road built.
1898	Bexhill Cycling Club and Hare and Hounds Athletic Club hold Cycling Tournament in Egerton Park.
1902	Egerton Park bought by Bexhill Corporation.
1902	Plans for Egerton Park Shelter Hall submitted (now the Museum)
1903	Egerton Park Shelter Hall built. This served as a concert hall and provided public toilets.
1905	Concert Party stage built at east end of Egerton Park.
1905-6	Egerton Park extended west by landfill to the current boundary with Brockley Road.
1906	Park extension opened by Lord Mayor of London Sir Walter Vaughan Morgan and Sheriffs of London
	with the State Coach on 21 st July.
	Egerton Park Pergola opened on the new land and leased to James Glover.
1906	Tram service started, the track passes down Egerton Road and along Brockley Road.
1907	Public bowling green laid out in Park and formation of Bexhill -on-Sea Bowling Club. Bowling Indoor
	bowling rink installed in Egerton Park Shelter Hall.
1912	13 acres of the Polegrove purchased by Corporation from John Webb.
1914	Egerton Park Shelter Hall becomes Bexhill Museum.
1915-1918	Museum commandeered by military as Officer's Mess.
1919	Museum re-established in Shelter Hall.
1920	Peace Day service in Park Pergola and celebrations in the Park.
1923	Polegrove opened as a recreation ground.
1924	Museum extended south.
1933	Egerton Park Pergola enclosed to form the Egerton Park Theatre, it was also used for indoor
	bowling. Opened by the Minister for Agriculture Major Elliot, Bexhill's Mayor was then the 9 th Earl De
	La Warr who was the Minister's Parliamentary Secretary. Egerton Park Indoor Bowls Club formed.
1933	Proposals to build an aquarium under Museum, this was never built.
1937	Swimming pool rebuilt with diving boards and water purification plant.
1945	Victory Thanksgiving service held around the bandstand in the Park.
1951	Scented garden for the blind created in the Park.
1960	Swimming Pool extended, new cubicles, sun terrace, kitchen & cafe.
1963	New staircase built to park cafe.
1980	Disabled toilets installed.
1986	Demolition of Swimming Pool.
1989	Park cafe becomes Museum Service office.
2004	Construction of Sure Start childcare centre.
