

Privacy notice – body-worn cameras

Rother District Council is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office for the purposes of processing personal data. Overt body-worn camera footage will be held and used in accordance with the requirements of United Kingdom data protection laws. The footage is not viewed and stored for up to 28 days, unless an incident is recorded, and the footage is required for the investigation of said incident. In this instance, the footage will be transferred to the incident file, and held in accordance with our relevant complaints, enforcement or retention policy timeframes. Material downloaded onto an investigation file would then be subject to the wider Council obligations under its data retention policies under GDPR.

We will only collect the minimum personal data required, which may include images of people, car registrations, copy of Identification, and sound. The information will be used by authorised officers mainly for monitoring Public Space Protection Orders, Environmental Health and Antisocial Behaviour, Neighbourhood Services (street cleansing and waste contract compliance, car parking enforcement) and Planning Enforcement. In accordance with Article 6(1)(e) of GDPR, we will not use your personal information in a way that may cause you unwarranted nuisance.
