



**IMPORTANT - THIS COMMUNICATION AFFECTS YOUR PROPERTY**

**ENFORCEMENT NOTICE**

**ISSUED BY:** Rother District Council

1. THIS NOTICE is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control, within paragraph (a) of section 171A(1) of the above Act, at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this notice, having regard to the provisions of the development plan and to other material planning considerations. The Annex at the end of the Notice and the enclosures to which it refers contain important additional information.

**2. THE LAND TO WHICH THE NOTICE RELATES**

Land at Bryants Wood, Wards Lane, Wadhurst, Ticehurst, East Sussex shown edged red on the attached plan (the 'Land')

**3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL – OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

Without planning permission the undertaking of large scale engineering works creating numerous hard-standing areas and severally altering the appearance of land.

**4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE**

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.

The development does not benefit from planning permission and is inappropriate within this location.

The development has caused significant harm to the character and appearance of the ancient woodland and the countryside within the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) designation and is contrary to the relevant planning policies – Rother Local Plan - Core Strategy 2014 Policy - OSS4 - General Development Considerations, Policy RA3 Development in the Countryside and Policy EN1 – Landscape Stewardship.

The Council do not consider that planning permission should be given because planning conditions could not overcome these objections.

**5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO**

- i) Cease all engineering operations within the Land,
- ii) Cease all importation of soil,
- iii) Cease the use of the land otherwise than in connection with the authorised forestry use of the land,

- iv) Remove all hard standings hard-core and other materials including rubble, rubbish, debris, tools and equipment from the land
- v) Reseed replant and re-profile the land so that it can be returned to its former woodland condition.
- vi) Remove all rubbish debris tools and equipment from the land arising from the compliance with step (v) above.

## **6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE**

Regarding steps 5 i) – iv) above One month after this notice takes effect and steps 5 v) and vi) six months after this notice takes effect.

## **7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT**

This notice takes effect on 16<sup>th</sup> November 2017 unless an appeal is made against it beforehand.

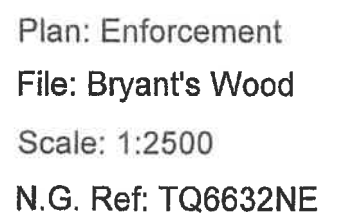
